^{• &}lt;u>Spero Meliora (2010)</u>: (work-in-progress) A visually stunning performance of dance and interactive multi-media with original music exploring civic life and urban revitalization of Detroit performed in-the-round. (premiered: *Detroit Institute of Arts*, 06/10)

• <u>Beauty Mirrored (Echoe & Amminius)</u> (2008): Based upon the Greek myth of the Narcissus, this duet abstractly explores the effects and ramification of a person's action or non-action to others. (premiered: Wayne State University, 04/08)

• <u>Emblaze (2007):</u> Based upon the myth of the Phoenix, this group piece explores the universal theme of birth, death and rebirth performed to music by John Adams. (premiered: Wayne State University, 11/04)

• Frenchie (Redux) (2006): Utilizing Haiku prose from Bassho, Busson and Issa as a device tool for movement material, this group piece demonstrates the process of going from an often layering and convoluted state to the very simple essence of a thought or idea. Frenchie is performed to French music ranging from Bridgette Bardot, to Emmanuel Chabrier. (premiered: Wells College; Aurora, NY 5/06)

• <u>Filipinese (2003):</u> A group piece that explores the relationship between Filipino folk and contemporary modern dance that celebrates modern society's diverse culture and lifestyle. This dance is performed to a mixed sound score of Filipino folk music by Ate Mariano and Ramon Obusan. (premiered: *Joyce SoHo; New York, NY 3/03*)

• <u>Mercurial Relapse (2003):</u> This quintet portrays a quest for fulfillment and while in a continuous state of transition, self-realizations unravel. This piece is danced to original music composed by Marty Beller. (premiered: *Joyce SoHo; New York, NY 3/03*)

• <u>ReAct(2005)</u>: This duet revisits the on-going relationship between two Filipino male individuals and their continuing rediscoveries and new epiphanies as they mature through life. This is sequel to *Acts of Intimacy*. (premiered: *Danspace Project; New York, NY 6/05*)

• <u>Past (the Third (2001)):</u> This large group piece delineates the idea that life has no boundaries. In any given situation there are "shades of grey" and one's role or responsibilities are often blurred and overlapped with other existing issues. (premiered: *Cunningham Studio; New York, NY 9/01)*

• <u>Acts of Intimacy (1998):</u> A choreographic collaboration exploring the innate sensibilities as a first generation Filipino in the United States. As a male choreographers, *Acts* addresses issues of gender and sexuality through the perspective as a gay Asians. It is danced to a score including traditional Filipino music and such diverse artists as k.d. lang, Ute Lemper and Ronisize.

(premiered: Joyce SoHo.; New York, NY; 10/98; co-choreographed with E. E. Balcos)

• *Tinikling:* (reconstruction) This piece is a Filipino folk dance miming the bamboo trappings in rice fields of the Philippine Islands.

• <u>Lattice</u>: This piece is an exploration of eastern and western forms of movement reflecting the weaving together of various cultures and the continued assimilation and acculturation that occur within Asians living in western society. As quoted by the Washington Post, Lattice "...weaves together images and gestures that suggest the complexity of Asian American life".

(premiered: 92nd St Y.; New York, NY; 6/96)

^{• &}lt;u>Kawayan/or Kapuluan</u>: an abstract piece incorporating the sensual movement of the dances of the southernmost region of the Philippines (Mindanao). Blended with contemporary dance, this dance reflects the conflict of tradition versus non-tradition and the harmonious coexistence of both.

(premiered: Palmer Auditorium; Connecticut College: New London, CT; 12/96)

•Slices (working title/work-in-progress): Through movement abstracted from mass culture and childhood experiences in Hawaii during the 1970s, this piece explores issues confronting Asian Americans today such as ethnic identity, religion, inter-family relationships and sexual preferences. The evolution of this work reflects the pursuit at acculturation and assimilation experienced by many Asian Americans. This piece is sub-contextually imbued with Filipino American issues that nonetheless relates to other cultures as well. (premiered: 92nd St Y.; New York, NY; 6/96)

• <u>Gemini</u>: The duality (yin-yang) and internal conflict of man versus himself is the basic premise for Gemini. Set to Winton Marsalis' contemporary jazz composition, this piece not only encompasses jazz motifs but also includes contemporary movement as well as simple, yet profound, gesticulation. This coming of age for the choreographer earmarks a realization of his self-identity and sexuality. (premiered: Experimental Theatre, Washington, DC; 1993)

• <u>Akulchurayhon</u>: An attempt at fusing contemporary jazz with ethnic dance was the focus of this piece. With original music by Mark Andes, Akulchurayshon abstracted detailed ethnic dance movements. (premiered: Experimental Theatre, Washington, DC; 1993)

• <u>Confidanté:</u> This poignant piece portrayed the close relationship between 3 dissimilar females. (premiered: UH-M Lab Theatre, Honolulu, Hawaii, DC; 1989)
